

NEWLY PUBLISHED AUTHOR SERVES UP “A PLATE OF EGGS”

At the Crows Nest launch of his first published book “A Plate of Eggs” writer and Roseville resident Steve Denham spoke about what he calls the quest for “new being”. The son of a Uniting Church minister, Steve described growing up in Sydney’s inner city, after his father was called to the ministry and moved the family from idyllic Austinmer on the NSW south coast when he was only four months old.

Steve’s father and mother, the team of ministers they worked with and members of the congregations of inner city parish churches in Redfern, Alexandria, Surry Hills and the Sydney CBD became inspirational role models as they put their faith into action out in the community - in the pubs, clubs and housing blocks of a low socioeconomic area.

A Plate of Eggs is a work of non-fiction, comprised of 68 short chapters - five and three quarter dozen “eggs” you might say - which add up to a commentary on modern life, influenced by the author’s early church upbringing and throughout his later life exploring alternative ideas and spiritual practices.

Steve has a degree in philosophy from Sydney University and so the book is an eclectic mix of real life experience, philosophical and spiritual ideas - all directed to shedding new light on what it means to become a seeker of truth, to embrace the unknown and embark upon the quest for new being. The author’s background mentions as influences the writings of Danish thinker Søren Kierkegaard and “In Search of the Miraculous” by Russian philosopher, P.D.Ouspensky.
