A bright idea

THE humble egg represents a number of things, but for author Steve Denham, of Roseville, an egg is an idea — 68 of which come together to make *A Plate Of Eggs*, his first published book.

“*A Plate Of Eggs* is more a book of questions than answers,” Denham said.

“The big questions are questions of who we are and where we are going — these are the questions that run through my book.”

A Plate Of Eggs comprises short chapters that mix real life experiences with philosophical ideas to shed light on, what Denham calls, our “speed-driven, space-compromised and time-poor lifestyle”.

“The book is neither self-help nor spiritual — it skirts around all of that, cutting across various religions, philosophies and spiritualities,” he said.
